This leads to more positive relationships and makes tackling problematic or tricky attitudes or behaviour less confrontational and more likely to be resolved positively. It's not about over the top or unwarranted praise but about recognising and developing skills they already possess to give them confidence and ability to cope with challenges. Influences that have been found to increase the likelihood of children developing mental health problems are known as 'risk factors'. Other influences that decrease the likelihood of children developing mental health problems are known as 'protective factors'.

Protective factors can help a child, even when risk factors are also present.

Sometimes risk factors result from isolated events, such as the death of a family member. Often however, several risk factors are related to one another and can have a major impact and lead to mental health difficulties – eg. family conflict, family breakdown, moving home, financial stress. However, if children experience protective factors this can help shield them from the impact of those risks. Good social and emotional skills, an easy temperament, caring supportive relationships with parents and a strong sense of belonging at school are just some of the protective factors than can help a child cope with challenging life events.
