A Spotlight on PE

We have had a fabulous, fun and very hot start to 2019.

Kindergarten have been working on the fundamental motor skills of balance, sprint run and catching.

Our Year 1 and 2 students have been playing lots of games as well as improving their hopping, jumping, galloping, catching and underarm throw. They have also been introduced to overarm throwing and tracking a rolled ball. Year 3 – 6 have spent 5 weeks on T Ball and 5 weeks on Cricket. These sports work on the fundamental skills of sprint run, overarm throw, catching and two handed strike. These are fundamental skills that will ensure our children are able to happily participate in every aspect of life and move forward into teenage years with confidence.
