From Our Librarian

FINE MOTOR SKILLS

Our children today are expected to successfully navigate an ever increasing range of reading material. In their quest for information children read books, pamphlets, magazines, signs, recipes, maps, game rules, e-books and the infinite number of web pages that can be accessed online. The list of skills our children now need when learning to read seems endless: holding a book, turning the pages, the direction we read, swiping the screen, re-orienting the screen, enlarging or reducing a web page, even evaluating the reliability of a website before using its information.

As teachers we recognize the importance of Gross Motor Skills and Fine Motor Skills. Gross Motor Skills are movements related to large muscles such as legs and arms and Fine Motor Skills are movements involving smaller muscle groups such as those in the hand and wrist. With technology at our fingertips fine motor dexterity and gross motor coordination is vitally important in children's physical development and learning.

How can parents help their child's skill development? How often is your child engaged in 'hands on' activities such as cutting straight lines, curvy lines, circles? How often is your child involved in gluing, folding paper, rolling play dough, colouring in and staying within the lines, tracing, threading string, tying knots, weaving, lids scrunching paper, twisting on containers, constructing with lego, playing board games, solving jigsaw puzzles, packing up and putting toys away? How often is your child outside skipping, hopping, bouncing a ball with one and two hands, throwing a ball against a wall and catching it, digging in the sand, kicking a ball, or skipping with a rope? These are just some of the tasks that strengthen muscles and coordination. Sometimes it is easier and simpler for children to be engaged with a screen device but do not underestimate the value of those manual tasks that get rather messy. They are just as important now as when you were a child, as well as children being responsible for cleaning up and packing everything away!

If parents would like to speak to their children please move to their class group and chat with them while they are with their teachers.


After School Cricket
