From Our Librarian

NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2020

Each year through our library lessons all children at St Mary's complete the Premier's Reading Challenge. 2020 will be no different even when we are working from home. We have already made a great start reading a significant number of books in our Library time. As the PRC School Co-ordinator I have already added these titles to your child's reading record. Each week I am adding links to texts for each child to view in their PRC age group. It is **essential** that EVERY child views the story links to complete their PRC Challenge. I would like your child to record the books they have viewed on a Reading Record which can be downloaded from the PRC website and a link to which I have provided. You might even create a reading record of your own, but it must include the title of the book and author. This will need to be given to Miss Gray by the end of Term 2 with your name and class at the top. From there I will add these titles to your reading record so that a certificate arrives for you from our Premier. This year Years 3 and 6 are eligible for special awards for completing the challenge 4 and 7 years in a row respectively.

Library Storytime

Watch out for Miss Gray's Storytime from the Library each week. After a few technical glitches everyone should now have access to the story and activities that we would normally do in the library...well maybe not this week's task as we don't have an oven but you do at home and I have now made my second batch of....!!!! 
This week's story won't last long as a new story will be coming to you each week in your Google Classroom!!!!
