Emotional Intelligence, (EI) is the ability to recognize, understand and manage our own emotions and to also recognize, understand and influence the emotions of others. It determines how we self regulate and deal with others in social, school and work situations.

It is now widely recognised that an individual's EI can have a huge impact on their success in school, work and life. The more developed a person's EI, the better able they are to manage difficulties and perform under pressure as well as being better able to get along with others. Emotional Intelligence is a trait that employers are now actively looking for in potential employees.

The Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) skills that are needed to promote Emotional Intelligence develop in children in different stages and can be actively cultivated by the adults around them, both at school and at home. Parents/ carers have a critical role to play in guiding and supporting children's social and emotional development.

The 5 Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) skill areas that children need to develop are—
