From Our Family Liaison Officer

"Positive social-emotional learning happens for your child when two vital elements come together:

- 1. They have real emotional experiences.
- 2. They see the way you positively respond to and manage those experiences.

This is the magic space where socialemotional learning happens for children... and parents"

This is a quote from a great article by Education writer Linda Stade titled "Parenting through your child's friendship issues". It can be quite difficult for parents and carers to refrain from getting caught up in the emotions that come with your child experiencing challenges with friendships. We don't like to see them upset or feeling lonely, but as hard as it may seem, they need these experiences to be able to learn to deal with them. They also need their parents/ carers to be the calm coach who can listen to them express their feelings then guide them to find ways to respond.

Children note how the adults around them react when they share their feelings with them. "When you react from your discomfort and race to fix things for your child, it makes YOU feel better. It doesn't make anything better for your child; no learning takes place and no skills are

"It is interesting that when a child is having friendship problems, parents will usually say, "Josie/Joe is having friendship problems at school." In reality, what is often happening is Joe or Josie just hasn't developed all of their friendship skills yet, neither have the children around them." It's important to remember that our primary school aged children are still learning these skills. There are many thoughful ways that parents/ carers can approach their child's friendship dilemmas which can really enhance their child's relationship skills. The article has some great practical suggestions for parents/ carers to help children navigate their friendships. It is well worth a read.

Next Thursday, Sept 10 is R U OK? Day. More details are on the back page of the newsletter with links to resources to help support these important conversations. It has been a challenging year for everyone and we've all had our fair share of tough days, but please remember that it is important to seek out the supportive family and friends around you when times are tough, as well as look out for others.


