or disrupt your child's learning and markedly reduces any financial pressure.

Every Day Counts

Attendance at school is critical.

The average number of days a child is absent from our school during a term is 5. Many, many children have 5 days absence or less per term. If your child is well in excess of 5 days absence you can be assured that it is affecting their learning.

When a child misses whole chunks of a term, their learning becomes disjointed. The skill they needed to learn to help build the next skill just does not happen. And it can lead to a child feeling inadequate or incapable.

Every day counts. Learning is important.

Smart Watches

There has been an increase in the amount of smart watches being worn by our students. Many smart watches have the capacity to link to a phone, connects to Apps and makes calls. For these reasons, we do not allow children to wear a smart watch at school.

Girls Uniform

A reminder that the 'old' girls uniform can only be worn this year. From 2021, all girls must be in a new summer uniform. There are still a number of girls who are yet to purchase one. Please call Leesa in the school office to place an order.

Late Arrivals

If your child arrives to school after the 9.00am bell, a parent is required to walk them into the office to sign them in. Recently, we have had an increase in the amount of students who are walking to the office after the bell without an adult to sign them in.

Led by trained facilitators, Seasons for Growth is an innovative grief and loss program for 6-12 y.o. NOT AGAIN!!

As parents we enjoy reading with our kids but often we are asked to read the same book over and over again. Are you guilty of accidentally putting that favourite book in a very safe place and forgotten just where it is? It can get a little boring... for us but that is definitely not the case for our children!!! Children who read and re-read the same book are gaining huge benefits!

DEVELOPING VOCABULARY

If you are at the point of having memorised that favourite book you have read every night for the past 3 weeks the chances are your child has too. When children read a book over and over again they are reading and developing a larger vocabulary. When you read aloud to your children they are becoming aware of how words are pronounced as well as the how words sound when they are put together. They benefit from hearing the patterns and rhythm of text which also affects the way they form and speak aloud their thoughts and ideas.

FLUENCY

Children who love to read the same book over and over again become fluent readers. The text is familiar and predictable so children tend to read without stumbling or stopping.

COMPREHENSION

Have you ever re-read a book and learnt something that you hadn't noticed before, ... especially in a good mystery! Each time children re-read the same book they discover more about the plot and the characters. They dig deeper into the story's meaning. Comprehension is at the heart of reading. Each time children re-read a book they are preparing to move onto more complex narratives.

CONFIDENCE

Re-reading books builds children's confidence. They read fluently and clearly understand what they are reading. When they are ready, children choose more challenging books because they have confidence in their own ability to read, navigate and problem-solve their way through the story.

The next time your child asks you to read that old favourite again know that you are helping your child grow into a confident reader.
