It has become more and more apparent to me. particularly over the last few weeks, that our children are hope-filled, flexible and so resilient. Our kids take change in their stride; both cohorting and wet weather have seen playground changes a regular part of our students day; the current dismissal arrangements have seen our children learn patience; even smaller changes such as no canteen at recess and drink bottles rather than bubblers have been quickly adapted. It's a lot to ask of 5-12 year olds. And they've done it so well.

Now, we are going back to a more familiar school experience. Catherine Kyle Why does my child borrow the same old Acting Religious Education Coordinator book?

Part of our job in teaching children to read is to introduce and talk about a new reader before reading the book. We talk about the title, characters and what will happen, before we begin to read just as a confident reader will read the blurb on the back of a book before borrowing it. We help children connect to the storyline by drawing on their own experiences.

With the unpredictable rain showers we have seen more damaged books than usual. When books get wet, they develop Being able to **predict** what may come next is an important skill when reading.
