School success starts with attendance

Attendance at school, on time, for the whole day is a fundamental indicator of a child's success at school. Children who attend school regularly are shown to achieve at higher levels than children who have regular absences. By being at school everyday children are better able to keep up with learning in class, build their confidence at school, have positive attitudes towards school and develop strong relationships with their peers.

This also applies to being on time in the morning and staying until the end of the school day. Being on time to school gives children a chance to settle well into the days learning tasks and decreases anxiety.

Good (or bad) habits start early and are harder to change the longer they go on. It is important to develop good attendance habits from Kinder to help children achieve their best at school. While they are so young it can be hard to see the years ahead, but positive attendance and punctuality will see children well into the future when they look to find part time jobs in high school or full time work at the completion of their education.






Year 4 Excursion to The Rocks
